RESOLUTION # 2013-103

A RESOLUTION OF RADNOR TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A STORMWATER MANAGEMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Township is developing a comprehensive Stormwater Collection and Management Program (the Program), designed to support regulatory compliance, address drainage and flooding problems, provide for stormwater infrastructure rehabilitation and environmental protection and restoration in a sustainable and environmentally conscious manner, and promote public education, outreach and involvement; and

WHEREAS, the Township is also proposing the establishment of a stormwater fee that includes a Stormwater Fund, with dedicated revenue through a stormwater fee levied on developed real property in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township Board of Commissioners and Township staff members responsible for the continued development and implementation of the Program and stormwater fee will benefit from the guidance, oversight and recommendations that can be provided by a citizen-based advisory committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for Radnor Township, Pennsylvania, that there is hereby established a Radnor Township Stormwater Advisory Committee as follows:

- a) The Board of Commissioners shall appoint an advisory committee of seven electors, one from each ward.
- b) The committee will include, but will not be limited to, Township property owners, representatives of the Township's business community, and representatives of local institutions and services agencies. Appointments shall include individuals with technical expertise and subject matter interest in stormwater management and its impact on water quality.
- c) The initial appointments will include two members appointed for a one year term; two members appointed for a two year term; and three members appointed for a three year term. Thereafter all appointments shall be for three year terms. The initial appointments will be made effective January 1, 2014.
- d) The duties of the advisory committee shall be as follows:
 - To engage in matters pertaining to the Program and the stormwater fee;
 - To conduct periodic assessments of program priorities and funding needs, including recommendations for potential adjustments in the stormwater fee once specific program objectives or milestones have been satisfied;

- To prepare a credit and/or grant policy for all parcel types, to promote Best Management Practices and the further reduction of stormwater runoff and impervious surface, for recommendation to the Board of Commissioners, within six months of the formation of the Committee;
- The Committee will biennially re-assess the credit program, and make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners regarding changes to said credit policy;
- The Committee will act as the Radnor Township liaison to the surrounding local governments who are in the same watersheds as Radnor Township, specifically, but no limited to Tredyffrin Township and Easttown Township;
- To monitor the formulation and implementation of the Program including the following elements:
 - Master planning;
 - Infrastructure inspection, assessments, rehabilitation, repair, and maintenance
 - MS4 Compliance;
 - Progress with respect to compliance with the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) general permit;
 - Capital improvement project planning, design, engineering, and construction oversight; and
 - Other related public stormwater management activities.
- To meet with the Program Administrator (Township Manager or his designee) at least three (3) times per year for the purpose of making recommendations on policy matters concerning the Program; and
- To provide advice and comments to the Board of Commissioners through regularly scheduled reports.
