



### Career Staff Expense vs. EMS Billing Income




## EMS Collegiate Stats 2013 – YTD 9/2016

#### **Total Uncollected**




#### **Total Collected**

## **Outsource EMS?**

### What happens if EMS doesn't exist at RFC?

- The #1 income source (EMS Billing) that helps to fund the Fire Company is eliminated.
- The income generated by the Ambulance Fund Drive is eliminated.
- The paid staff, the majority of whom are cross-trained for fire and EMS responses, will be laid off.
- Response times to fire calls, especially during the day will be significantly impacted.
- Operational command and control of fire and EMS under one entity will be eliminated.
- The Fire Company will require increased funding due to the points aforementioned.

# Actions Underway or Considered to Improve Efficiency

#### Grants & Loans

- Continue to apply for state and federal grants for equipment and personnel needs. Recently notified we will receive a grant award through the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters (AFG) for portable radios for the 2015-2016 cycle. For the 2016 – 2017 AFG cycle we are applying for fire hose and Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA).
- Apply for loans for apparatus through apparatus vendors and/or PA Office of the State Fire Commissioner.

#### Volunteer Recruitment

Increasing efforts to bring in additional fire/EMS volunteers.

#### EMS Billing & Collections

- Currently reviewing (3) proposals for services, along with updated contract with existing provider.
- Consideration is being given to taking patients with outstanding bills in the collections phase of the EMS
  Billing cycle to small claims court. This will require the support of the Township and has the potential for
  negative backlash in the community.

#### Career Staff

- Continue minimum staffing practice to reduce costs, however presents a service delivery problem.
- Adopt hybrid schedule with continued utilization of full-time and part-time staff hours.

## **2017 Budget Request**

- \$150,000 in additional funding to support the Radnor Fire Company (Fire and EMS).
  - Assist with existing uncollectible payments for services in EMS billing.
  - Assist with increased paid staffing expenses due to decline in volunteerism.
  - Assist with planned capital projects.
