

RADNOR TRAIL HISTORICAL SIGNS

In 2011, two new historical signs were installed along the Radnor Trail to commemorate Philadelphia & Western Railway stations that once operated there. They are located at Old Sugartown Road and West Wayne Avenue.

These signs represent the second phase of our long-term project to create interpretive panels commemorating all of the stations that once stood along the trail. Their concrete foundations still stand beside the trail, but it's still hard to imagine that today's trail was once lined with railroad stations!

The signs are very durable and will last for many years, but they are expensive to fabricate. We need your help to further tell the history of this important part of Radnor's past. If you would like to give to this project, your name could be displayed on a future sign.
