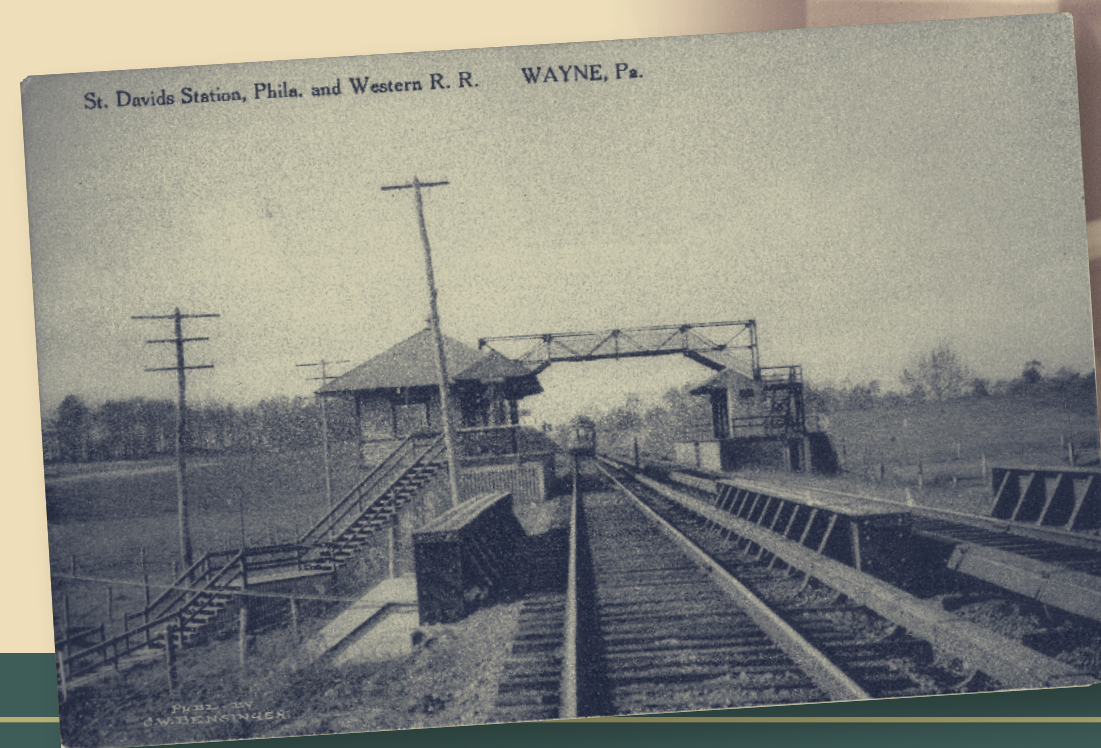


# WAYNE-ST. DAVIDS STATION

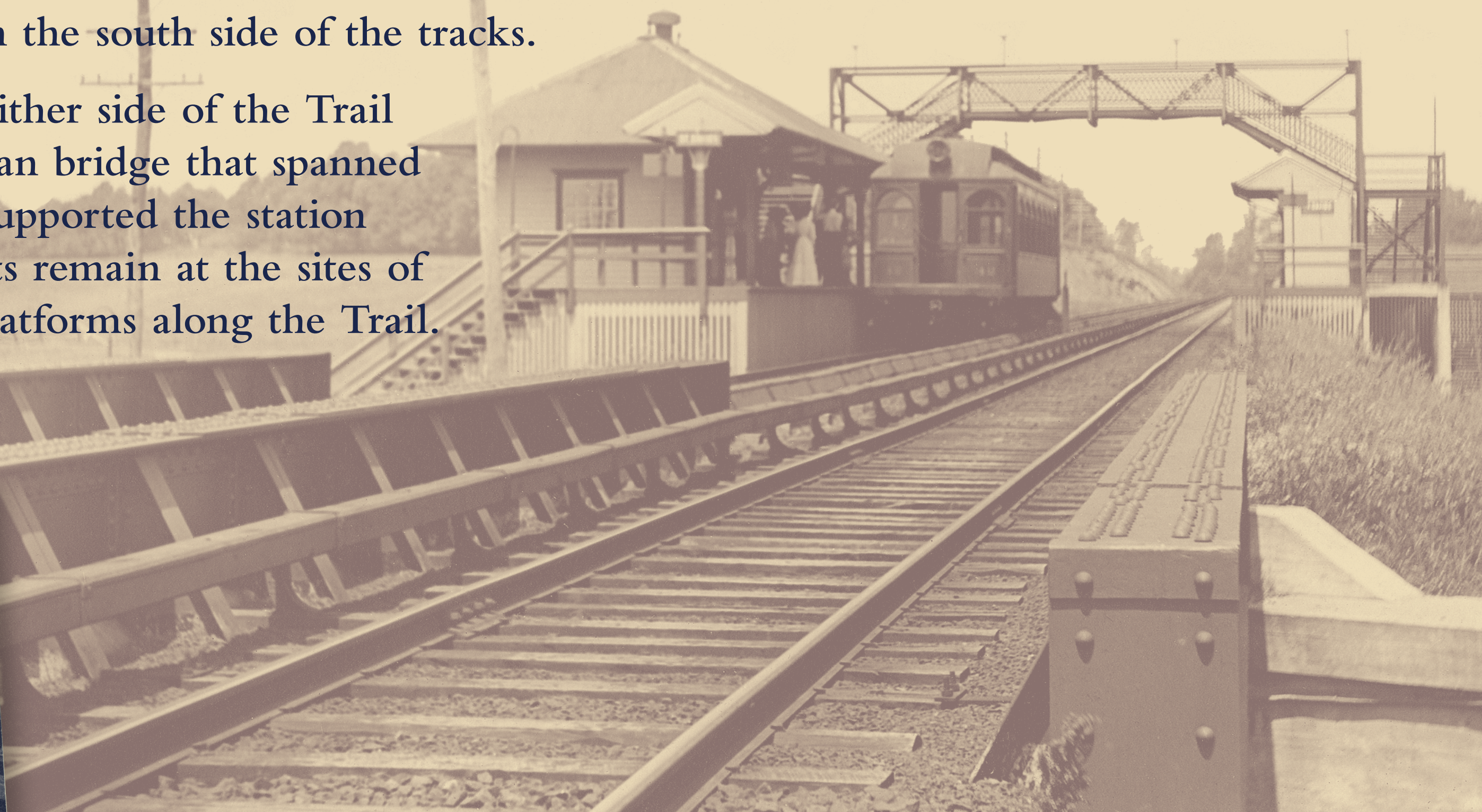
One of the original 13 stations on the P&W route, the St. Davids Station was renamed as Wayne-St. Davids in 1928. A ticket agent was housed for a short time in a small wooden building on the south side of the tracks.

The concrete pilings on either side of the Trail once supported a pedestrian bridge that spanned the tracks. Smaller ones supported the station platforms. Similar supports remain at the sites of other stations and train platforms along the Trail.
