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Commissioner Larkin moved to approve consent agenda items a through n, seconded by Commissioner Farhy. The motion passed 6-0 with Commissioner Booker absent.

# <u>3. Committee Reports</u> <u>A. Authorization of the Swearing in of New Police Officer for Radnor Township Police</u> Department to replace Retired Officer – Richard Braxton

Commissioner Larkin moved to Authorize the Swearing In of New Police Officer, Richard Braxton, seconded by Commissioner Farhy. Commissioner Borowski asked Chief Flanagan to speak on the new hire, Richard Braxton. The motion passed 7-0.

### B. Waiver of §245-22.A of the Stormwater Management Ordinance - 420 St. Davids Road

Commissioner Larkin asked Steve Norcini to speak on the request. There was discussion amongst Commissioners and Staff. Commissioner Booker and Commissioner Farhy were concerned with granting stormwater waivers for smaller projects, which can incrementally add to impervious area and runoff in the Township. Steve Norcini noted that the applicant is offering to put in a rain garden to help rate control.

Commissioner Larkin called the vote, the vote passed 4-3 with Commissioners Booker, Farhy and Abel against.

### C. Waiver of §245-22.A of the Stormwater Management Ordinance - 780 Fawn Hill Road

Commissioner Larkin asked Steve Norcini to speak on the request. The applicant is reducing the footprint of impervious on the property. He recommends the Board ask the applicant to come forth with some type of stormwater mitigation. There was discussion amongst Commissioners and Staff.

Commissioner Mulroney moved to table the item, seconded by Commissioner Borowski. The motion to table passed 6-1 with Commissioner Booker against.

Commissioner Mulroney asked the Engineer to reach out to the application regarding mitigation.

# <u>D.</u> Resolution #2020 – 150 - Awarding Contract #B-20-012 Cumberland Place Storm Sewer to G&B Construction, Incorporated, in the Amount of \$116,731

Commissioner Larkin moved to approve the Resolution, seconded by Commissioner Borowski. Steve Norcini, Township Engineer, spoke on the project, which is to be paid from the Stormwater Fund.

Commissioner Larkin called the vote, the motion passed 7-0.

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E. Resolution #2020-138 – Authorizing Payment to Aqua for the Relocation of a Fire

Hydrant as Part of the King of Prussia Road/Eagle Road/Pine Tree Road Intersection

Improvement Project, in the Amount of \$10,900.00

Commissioner Larkin moved to approve the Resolution, seconded by Commissioner Mulroney. Steve Norcini, Township Engineer, spoke on the project. This project is funded by the GOB Bond.

Commissioner Booker is against the project and feels it will cause more bridge strikes.

Commissioner Larkin called the vote, the motion passed 6-1 with Commissioner Booker against.

## F. Ordinance #2020-25- (Introduction) Repealing Chapter 260, Taxation, Article I, Amusement Tax, Sections 260-1 through 260-17.

Commissioner Larkin moved to Introduce the Ordinance, seconded by Commissioner Enderle.

There was discussion amongst Commissioners. The motion to Introduce the Ordinance passed 6-1 with Commissioner Farhy against.

# G. Resolution #2020-78 Establishing a Policy for Granting or Denying Modifications Under the Radnor Township Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance and Creating a Capital Improvement Fund to Accept Fees and Contributions

Commissioner Larkin moved to approve the Resolution, seconded by Commissioner Borowski. Colby Grim, Township Solicitor, spoke on the policy and creating an improvement fund to accept fees and contributions. There was discussion amongst Commissioners and Staff.

Commissioner Larkin called the vote, the motion passed 5-2 Commissioners Abel and Booker against.

## <u>H.</u> Discussion and Direction to send OPEB Financing Project to CARFAC for Additional Review

Commissioner Larkin requested this item be placed on the Agenda and requests the item be moved to CARFAC. The Board is in support of sending the OPEB Financing Project to CARFAC for additional review. Commissioner Larkin asked for a response from CARFAC within the next six months.

### 4. Reports of Standing Committees of the Board

Commissioner Borowski reported the Shade Tree Commission fall planting has been done, with the help of Public Works, Steve Norcini, Johns Hosbach, and Trish Sherwin. Over 130 trees have been planted within the Township. The Shade Tree Commission has recently received a grant from the PA Horticultural Society, receiving 24 trees.

Commissioner Borowski reported the Library had a very successful Elves for the Shelves event.

### 5. New Business

<u>a. Motion to cancel December 21st Board of Commissioners Meeting</u> Commissioner Larkin moved to cancel the December 21st Board of Commissioners Meeting, seconded by Commissioner Farhy. The motion passed 7-0.

Commissioner Abel asked if the Township received an update on the CARES Act. Bill White, Township Manager, noted the items did not qualify for the CARES Act and spoke on what can be submitted. Revenue loss recovery is not part of the CARES Act.

Commissioner Abel would also like to bring in a City Planner to look at downtown Wayne with the closing of storefronts. Bill White, Township Manager, noted that would be done with the update of the Comprehensive Plan. There was discussion amongst Commissioners and Staff.

### 6. Old Business

Commissioner Booker spoke on consent agenda item n, Resolution 2020-148, Wage and Salary Schedule. He does not agree with the pay increase.
