

Resolution No. 2020-47

**WHEREAS**, COVID-19 has been declared by the World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention a “public health emergency of international concern”; and

**WHEREAS**, both the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Delaware County have declared a state of emergency due to the identification of COVID-19 infected citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501(b) of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa. C.S.A. 7101 et seq., Board of Commissioners President Jack Larkin, Esq. declared the existence of a public health local disaster emergency in Radnor Township, Delaware County, Pennsylvania on March 12, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners met on March 16, 2020 and extended the initial declaration; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners now desires to further extend the initial declaration of March 12, 2020.


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Radnor Township extends the initial public health local disaster emergency declaration by an additional sixty days or whenever Governor Wolf ends the statewide disaster declaration, whichever is later.
