**NEW BUSINESS**

**(Tabled from previous month)**

1. Per PennDot, a resident requests approval to install "Hidden Driveway" signage on Gulph Creek Road approaching address #240. Also requests approval to install "School Bus Stop Ahead" signs

Highway Patrol Officer Ken Piree stated that the Hidden Driveway sign has already been installed. The "School Bus Stop Ahead" sign has not been posted. There is nowhere that they can properly post this for a proper pre-warning effect. He will follow up with the homeowner to discuss.

4. Presley Schwinn of 600 Block of Mill Road for speeding concerns

Highway Patrol Officer Ken Piree left a voicemail for Ms. Schwinn regarding her concerns. Two studies were performed back in 2002. There were no concerns for speeding at that time. Highway Patrol will put a speed radar device down on this street at a later date to warn traffic of their speed.

Highway Patrol also noted that traffic calming via speed humps are installed on this street.

Mr. Patel,

The Township very much appreciates the Safety Evaluation and All-Way Stop sign evaluation performed at the above referenced locations. To ensure we are all on the same page, please the following as it pertains to your letter:


- All-Way Stop sign request: Denied by the Department
- Crosswalk, South Wayne and Pembroke: the Township will evaluate if this project is pursued, and if so, through the Penn DOT process
- Safety Evaluation: the Township requests that the safety plan, noting the all-way stop at South Wayne and Windermere not be implemented.

After meetings with the Commissioner, Township Staff, and members of the Radnor Fire Company, we request the all-way stop at South Wayne and Windermere not be constructed. The Township requests that all pavement markings, the "bump out", etc., be

installed after resurfacing, as they currently exist today. The Township may wish to make modifications to the "bump out" in the future, and will contact the Department should we wish to request any changes.

The Township thanks the Department for their ideas and response to the aforementioned items. Please contact me should you have any questions.
