TO: A Staff Traffic Committee Meeting was held on June 18, 2014 and was attended by Commissioner James C. Higgins; Stephen F. Norcini, Director of Public Works; Lieutenant Andrew Block; Officers Mark Stiansen and John Miller, Highway Patrol; William Gallagher, Supervisor of Parking; Vera DiMaio, Administrative Assistant; and Radnor residents Julie Pierce, Cecile Szele, Nicole Moore and Amy Epstein.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Nicole Moore requests a speed hump study for the 300 block of Eagle Road.

The Highway Patrol Unit conducted a traffic calming study in the 300 block of Eagle Road. The results of the study revealed that the average daily traffic for this section of Eagle Road is 3933 vehicles. The 85th percentile speed for this section of Eagle Road is 38 MPH. Mrs. Moore collected and submitted the speed hump petition with 83% of the residents on Eagle Road, between Overhill Road and Strafford Avenue, supporting the speed humps. The speed hump petition also reflected that 93% of the residents on West Avenue (Eagle Road to the cul-de-sac) supporting the speed humps. Staff Traffic Committee recommends that speed humps be installed in the 300 Block of Eagle Road as all requirements of Radnor Code, Chapter 270 Article VIII, entitled Traffic Calming, have been attained.

2. John Church resident of Clover Lane has concerns about speeding on Clover Lane.

The Staff Traffic Committee recommends the following enhancements on Clover Lane to:

- "Watch Children" signs to be upgraded to the high visibility fluorescent green.
- Change out the "One-Way" sign shortly after the curve and replace with a 15 MPH speed limit sign.
- Relocate the second 15 MPH on Clover Lane as it is obstructed by a tree.
- Paint fog lines on the North side of the roadway where residents park their vehicles.
