Crime Alert - Theft

Police Alert - Residential Fire

On 7/7/22, at approximately 2330 hours, the Radnor Police Department, along with the Radnor Fire Company, responded to the unit block of Louella Court after a neighbor reported seeing flames from a residence. No one was home at the time of the incident and the fire was extinguished without any injuries occurring. The cause of the blaze is currently under investigation.

Counterfeit Money - 151 Sugartown Rd. - Wawa Store

On Friday, 7/8/22, at approximately 6:06 PM, staff at the Wawa Store, located at 131 Sugartown Rd., report receiving three (3) fake \$100.00 bills. Staff for the Wawa report that three subjects, 2 black males and 1 black female used three separate counterfeit \$100.00 bills to make several small purchases. Video of this incident showed the incident as staff relayed it to Police.

Retail Theft - TJ Maxx - 550 E. Lancaster Av.

Burglary Attempt - Unit block of Ivy Lane

On 7/18/2022, at approximately 6:18 AM, an unknown subject enter an open garage in the unit block of Ivy Lane and attempted to gain access to several vehicles in the garage. The actor is described as an unknown race male, wearing dark pants and a long sleeve hooded sweatshirt, and gloves. The actor attempted to enter two locked vehicles but was unsuccessful. The actor is believed to have left the area in a white sedan, possibly a Toyota Corolla.

Theft from Vehicle - 200 David Drive, "B" building

Post Date:07/19/2022 8:24 AM

Sometime between 4:00 PM on 7/17/2022 and 10:30 AM on 7/18/2022, a Nissan sedan was entered while parked in the lot of "B" building, of 100 Charles Drive. The vehicle was left unlocked at the time of the theft and had a women's purse stolen from inside of it.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.

With this letter we wish to recognize Officer Mark Bates and hope you will include this in his file as an example of his exceptional service.

Officer Bates responded to our call to 911 on Wednesday, July 13, 2022, along with EMTs from the fire company. My husband was recently diagnosed with lung cancer and was experiencing debilitating pain in his abdomen; he needed to get to the hospital. We learned later that my husband had air in his belly and would have died had it not been treated immediately. He received emergency surgery and is now recovering.

We are grateful for Officer Bates' quick response and focused, calm presence during an incredibly intense situation; it saved my husband's life.

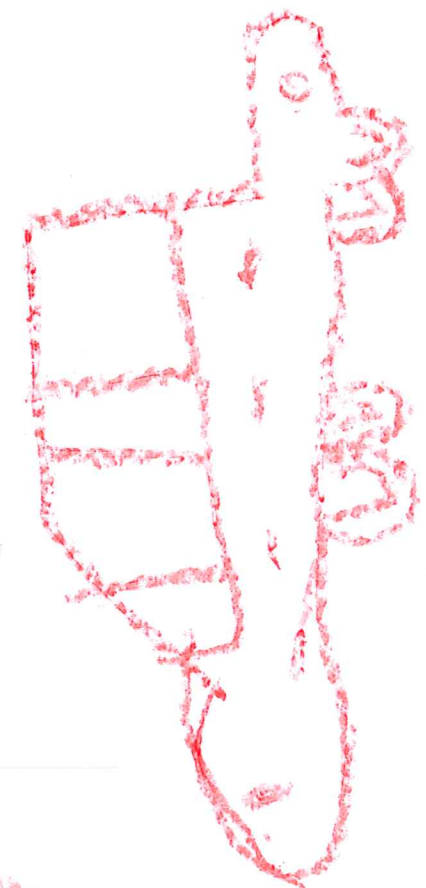
Chief Flanagan,

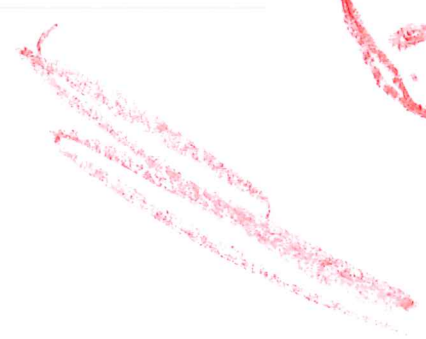

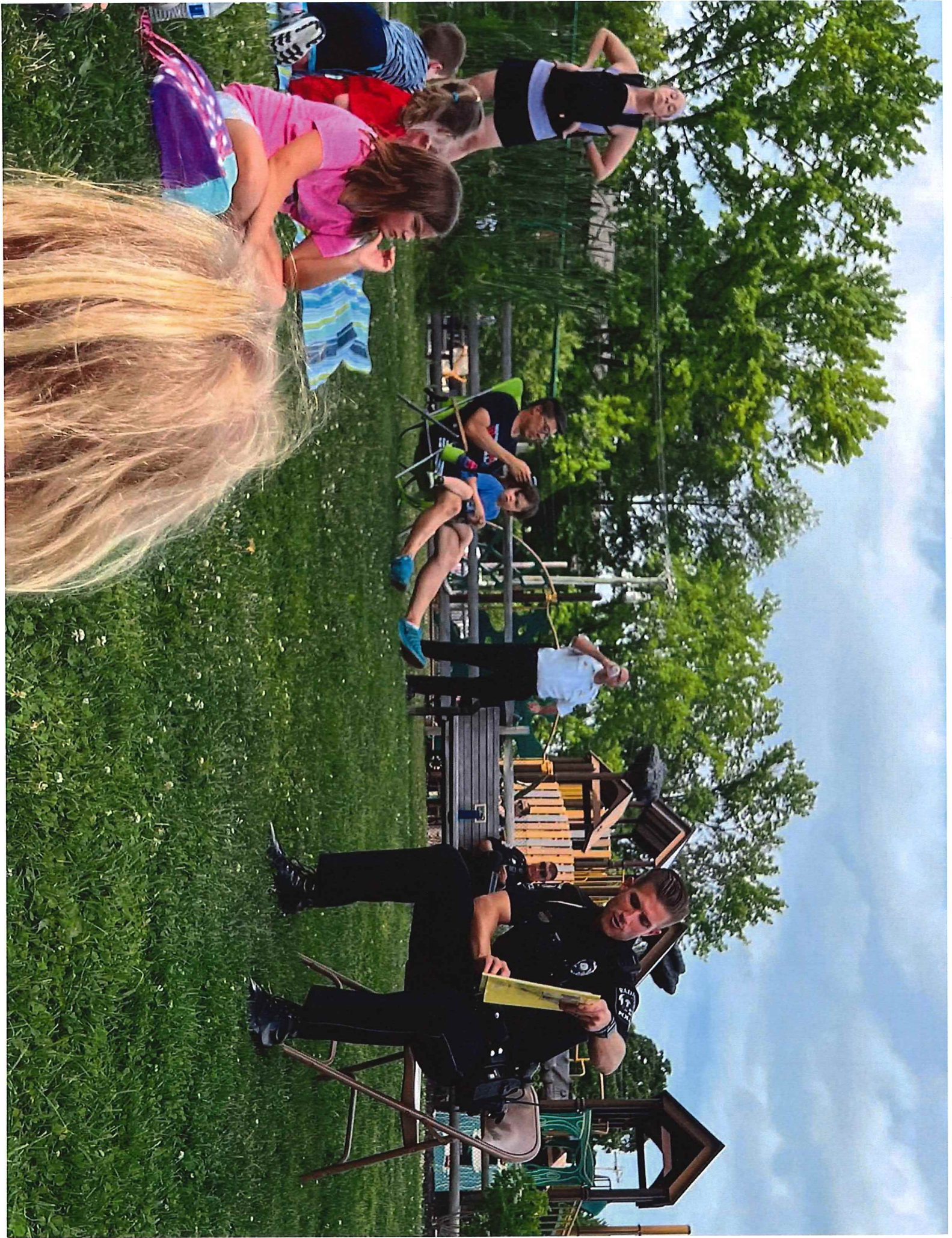

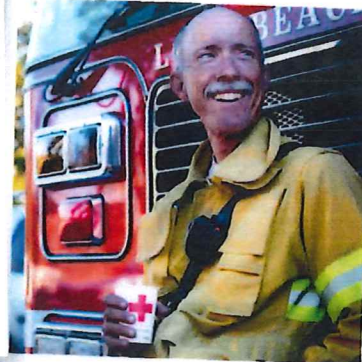
