Crime Alert - Theft of Motor Vehicles - Villanova and Bryn Mawr

On Tuesday, December 6, 2022, Radnor Police received a report of a stolen vehicle from the 100 block of Trianon Lane, Villanova. The victim reported their black 2021 Jeep Grand Cherokee was stolen from in front of their residence between Monday, December 5, 2022, at 8:30 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. on December 6th. The vehicle was left unlocked with the keys inside.

Also on December 6, 2022, Radnor Police received a report of a stolen 2020 Land Rover Sport from a driveway in the 100 block of Arbor Place, Bryn Mawr. The victim reported parking their vehicle around 11:00 a.m. and discovered it missing a short time later. Private security footage captured a black male, wearing a gray sweatshirt, light blue jeans, with white and blue sneakers, remove the vehicle at 11:14 a.m. The vehicle was left unlocked with the keys inside.

Retail Theft - Beer Yard - 218 E. Lancaster Av.

On Tuesday, 12/13/2022 at approximately 6:23 PM a retail theft occurred at 218 E. Lancaster AV., the Beer Yard. Staff from the Beer Yard reported that two black males made several large purchases of beer using a credit card. Upon completing the sales, it was determined that the credit card was fraudulent. When staff approached the two males about the credit card they fled from the store in red minivan.

Theft from Motor Vehicles - 219 Sugartown Rd. - LA Masion Apartments

On Thursday, 12/15/2022, at approximately 4:04 AM, a resident called to report four males, wearing ski masks, breaking into cars at the La Masion Apartments, located at 219 Sugartown Rd. The caller further reported the four subjects were operating out of their own vehicle but could not give a description of the vehicle. While checking the area for the actors, Radnor Police observed an unknown make and model SUV occupied by four subjects in ski masks. When Officers attempted to stop this car, it fled the area at a high rate of speed. Due to safety concerns, both for Police and the public, a vehicle pursuit was NOT initiated. Investigation revealed several vehicles were broken into in the lots of the La Masion Apartments.

Theft of a Package - 100 block of Garrett Av.

On Saturday, 12/17/2022, between 2:00 PM and 5:37 PM, the resident of the 100 block of Garrett Av., reported having a package stolen. The package was confirmed to have been delivered at 2:00 PM and when the victim went to retrieve the item at 5:37 PM it was gone.

Residential Burglary - 300 block of Edgehill Rd.

On Saturday, 12/17/2022, at approximately 9:10 PM, the resident from the 300 block of Edgehill Rd., reported that their home was burglarized. The resident reported leaving the home at approximately 5:00 PM and when they returned home at approximately 9:10 PM they discovered their rear door kicked in.

Theft of a Wallet - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - TJ Maxx Store

On 12/16/2022, at approximately 5:30 PM the victim had their wallet stolen out of their purse while shopping at the TJ Maxx store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. The victim reports they were "distracted" by a white male, in his 40's with a light beard and wearing a black coat. The male was in the company of an unknown race female with long hair who is believed to have removed the wallet from the victim's purse.

Residential Burglary - 100 block of Harvard La.

On Tuesday, 12/21/2022, at approximately 8:38 AM, a residential burglary was discovered in the 100 block of Harvard La. Video surveillance showed that on Thursday, 12/15/2022, at approximately 7:00 PM, three unknown subjects entered the house after breaking through a ground floor window.

Vandalism to Vehicle - Ithan Valley Park

On Tuesday, 12/21/2022, at approximately 4:30 PM, the victim's vehicle was vandalized while parked in Ithan Valley Park. The victim reports they parked and then took their dog for a walk. When they returned the rear passenger window of their car was smashed. The interior of the car appeared rummaged, but at the time of the report, nothing appears to have been stolen.

Theft from Vehicle - 421 E. Lancaster Av.

Sometime during the overnight hours of 12/15/2022, the victim had items stolen from their vehicle which was parked in the lot of 421 E. Lancaster Av. The car, a 2005 Volkswagen Jetta, had a backpack stolen which contained various electronic items. There were no signs of forced entry into the vehicle.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a restricted area). Only reports that document behavior that is indicative of criminal activity related to terrorism will be shared with federal partners. Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported.

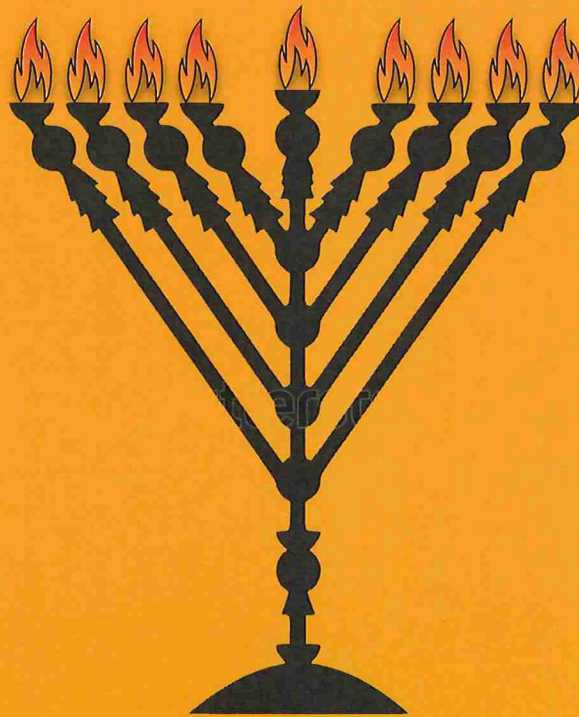

Chanukah Foods

Since the Chanukah miracle involved oil, it is customary to eat foods fried in oil. The Eastern-European classic is the potato latke (pancake) garnished with applesauce or sour cream, and the reigning Israeli favorite is the jelly-filled sufganya (doughnut).

Dreidel: the Chanukah Game

On Chanukah, it is customary to play with a "dreidel" (a four-sided spinning top bearing the Hebrew letters, nun, gimmel, hei and shin, an acronym for nes gadol hayah sham, "a great miracle happened there"). The game is usually played for a pot of coins, nuts, or other stuff, which is won or lost based on which letter the dreidel lands when it is spun.

Chanukah Gelt

In today's consumer-driven society, people tend to place great importance on giving Chanukah gifts. However, the tradition is actually to give Chanukah gelt, gifts of money, to children. In addition to rewarding positive behavior and devotion to Torah study, the cash gifts give the children the opportunity to give tzedakah (charity). This has also spawned the phenomenon of foil-covered "chocolate gelt."

Why we give gelt.

What it Means For You

Noting that one should spend time in close proximity to the Chanukah lights, the Previous Rebbe would say, "We must listen carefully to what the candles are saying." So what are the flickering flames telling us? Here are some messages:

- a. Never be afraid to stand up for what's right. Judah Maccabee and his band faced daunting odds, but that didn't stop them. With a prayer on their lips and faith in their heart, they entered the battle of their lives—and won. We can do the same.
- b. Always increase in matters of goodness and Torah-observance. Sure, a single flame was good enough for yesterday, but today needs to be even better.
- c. A little light goes a long way. The Chanukah candles are lit when dusk is falling. Perched in the doorway, they serve as a beacon for the darkening streets. No matter how dark it is outside, a candle of G-dly goodness can transform the darkness itself into light.
- d. Take it to the streets. Chanukah is unique in that its primary mitzvah is observed in public. It's not enough to be a Jew at heart, or even at home. Chanukah teaches us to shine outwards into our surroundings with the G-dly glow of mitzvahs.
- e. Don't be ashamed to perform mitzvahs, even if you will feel different. Rather, be like a menorah, proudly proclaiming its radiant uniqueness for all to see.

How to Play Dreidel

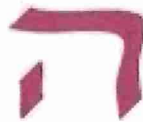
if the dreidel lands on a...



Nun Absolutely nothing happens. Nun stands for the Yiddish word nul, which means zero. It's time for the player to your left to take a spin.



Gimel You get to take the whole pot! Gimmel stands for gantz, which means whole. Everyone, including you, now puts another unit into the pot, and the person to your left tries his luck at spinning.



Hey You get to take half of the pot. Hey stands for halb, half. If the pot has an odd amount of units, don't try to split that penny, nut, or piece of chocolate in half. Leave the odd item there.

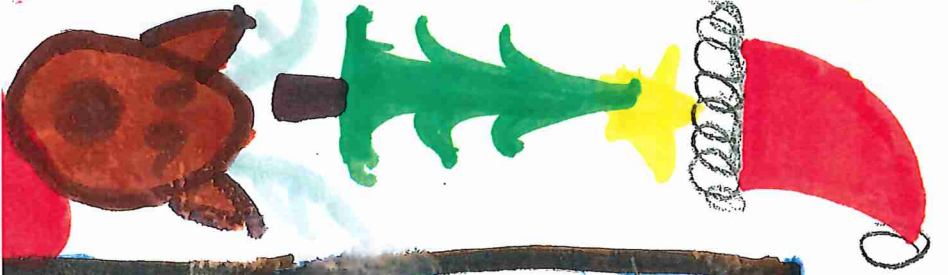


Shin You put a unit into the pot. Shin is for shenk, yes, that means "give." You can speed up the game by upping the ante, raising shin and post-gimmel contributions to two, three or even four units. Any player that cannot contribute after landing on a shin or after a fellow player lands on a gimmel, is out of the game. The game ends when there is one player left.
