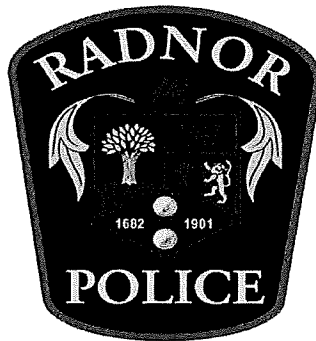

CRIME ALERTS
JANUARY 2023

Radnor Township Police Department is investigating a commercial burglary of a retail establishment in the 200 blk of West Lancaster Avenue, Wayne. The burglary occurred sometime during the overnight hours of Friday, December 30, 2022, and Saturday morning, December 31, 2022 at 0830hrs. Anyone in the area with video surveillance is encouraged to review during this time period for any suspicious activity. Anyone with information is asked to contact Radnor Police at 610-688-5600.

On Monday, 1/2/2023, at approximately 8:56 AM a burglary was discovered at 192 Landover Rd., Lovecchio's Pizza. Investigation revealed that an unknown actor or actors entered through an unlocked delivery door and removed cash and a cash register from the store. It is believed that the burglary occurred sometime between the night of 12/31/2022 and the time of the report.

On Monday, 1/2/2023, the T.J. Max Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av., reported a retail theft that had occurred the day prior on 1/1/2023. Store security reports that video footage shows a white female with blonde hair, loaded several items from the men's section of the store into an empty shopping cart. At approximately 4:30 PM the blonde female is seen exiting the store with the items from the shopping cart in her possession, while bypassing all point of sale terminals.

On Monday, 1/2/2023, at approximately 6:04 PM, staff from the T.J. Maxx store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av., reported a retail theft had just occurred. Store employees report a black male, tall, with a large build, is seen on video removing a Gucci watch from the jewelry case and hiding it on his person. The male exited the store without paying for the watch and was last seen exiting the parking lot in a black Range Rover.

On Sunday, 1/1/2023 at approximately 3:00 AM, the terrace of 400 N. Bellevue Av. was vandalized. The victim reports that someone unknown, threw white paint all over the terrace.

On 1/3/23 at approximately 1220 hours, a silver, newer model SUV/Crossover style vehicle drove onto the Radnor Pedestrian trail at the Liberty Lane entrance. The vehicle was traveling at a very high speed towards Brookside Avenue on the trail. The vehicle damaged the gate upon exiting on Brookside Avenue. Anyone with further information is asked to contact the Radnor Police.

El Limon, located at 128 W. Lancaster Av., was discovered to have been burglarized overnight between 1/8/2023 and 1/9/2023. Surveillance footage showed two actors enter the store at approximately 4:30 AM on 1/9/2023. The actors removed cash and a money box from the store. No demographic information is available on the actors due to the fact they were wearing hoodies and gloves.

Several vehicles parked in the area of the 200 and 300 block of E. Lancaster Av. were broken into on Monday, 1/9/2023. Several vehicles had their windows smashed out and had personal items stolen. The thefts occurred between the hours of 5:00 PM and 6:00 PM.

On Wednesday, 1/11/2023, a vehicle parked at Radnor High School had its catalytic converter stolen. The vehicle was a red Mitsubishi Outlander and the theft occurred between 6:30 AM and 4:00 PM. Police are awaiting video surveillance.

On Tuesday, 1/17/2023, store employees reported a retail theft that occurred on Saturday, 1/14/2023. Store security discovered the theft while reviewing video surveillance. The video showed two black males enter the store and head to the sneaker area. Both males removed bags that were hidden in their pants and loaded the bags with sneakers. The males then exited the store without paying.

On 1/22/23 at approximately 2108 hours, Radnor police were dispatched to the 300 block of E. Lancaster Avenue for a theft. A male wearing a black puffy jacket entered the store and attempted to purchase four cigars. When his credit card was declined, he removed the items from the store without paying. Anyone with further information is asked to dial 911.

On 1/22/23, Radnor Police responded to the 1000 block of Conestoga Road for a report of a catalytic converter theft that occurred sometime over the past two weeks. Investigation is ongoing.

On 1/21/23, Radnor Police were dispatched to the 700 block of E. Lancaster Avenue for a report of a theft from vehicle. The victim's vehicle was entered by breaking the window and removing personal items therein. Investigation is ongoing. Please contact police if further information is available.

On Wednesday, 1/25/2023, the resident of 107 Bloomingdale Av. discovered a package missing. The resident reports a package was delivered to their apartment on 1/14/2023 from their insurance company. The resident reports never receiving the package.

On Friday, 1/27/2023, at approximately 10:53 AM, Radnor Police discovered a broken window to a residence on the unit block of Harford Lane. After securing the property, it was determined that the home was burglarized at an unknown, earlier date and time.

On Friday, 1/27/2023, at approximately 3:12 PM, the victim reports a theft of a package from the lobby of their apartment at the Radnor Crossing Apartments. The victim reports that an insulated bag was stolen from a new delivery driver kit for DoorDash.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.

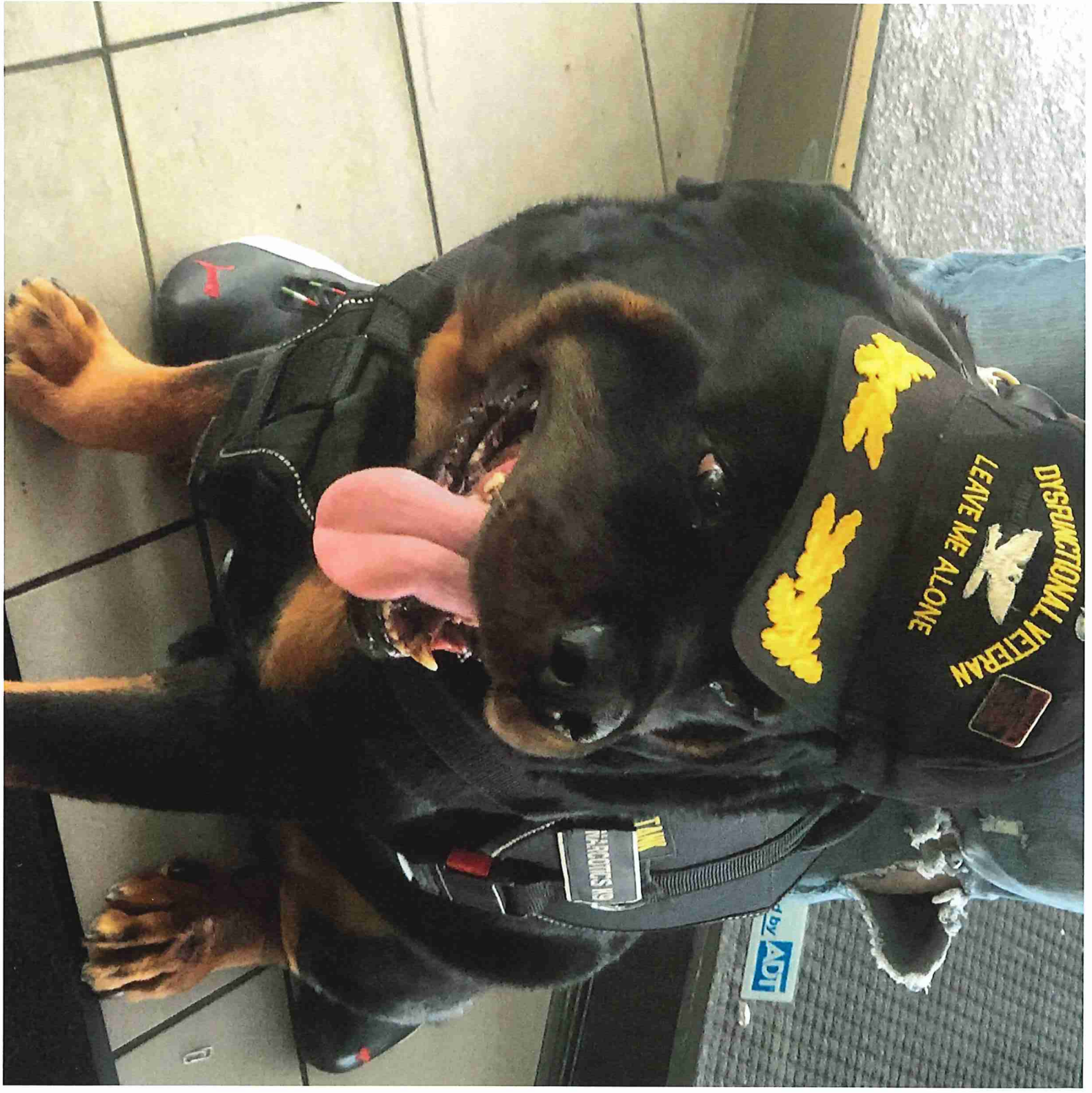
