**Retail Theft - 550 E. Lancaster Av. - T.J. Maxx Store**

On Tuesday, 2/28/2023, at approximately 5:51 PM store security reported a retail theft had occurred at the T.J. Maxx Store located at 550 E. Lancaster Av. on 2/26/2023. Security reports a black male and a black female, both wearing facial masks, fled the store with high end purses. The subjects were last seen fleeing the parking lot in a unknown make or model, black vehicle.

**Fire - 57 Garrett AV. - Emlin Tunnell Field**

Resident reports a fire inside a port-o-potty at 57 Garrett Av., Emlin Tunnell Park. The resident observed two juveniles, a white male and a white female, along with an adult black female enter the port-o-potty. When they exited, black smoke was observed coming from inside of the toilet. Investigation revealed that the toilet paper roll inside of the pot-o-potty was set on fire.

**Crime Alert - Pickpocket**

On 3/5/23 at around 1300 hours, a customer at a local restaurant in the 700 block of E. Lancaster reported her wallet was taken. Several credit card purchases were attempted and made at various businesses in the area. Residents and patrons are reminded not to leave valuables unattended. Please dial 911 and ask to speak with an officer if you have further information.

**Criminal Mischief**

On 3/8/23, several reports of broken vehicle windows were broken by rocks in an act of suspect criminal mischief. The incidents occurred sometime overnight in the 200 block of Midland Avenue and 100 block of W. Wayne Avenue. Anyone with further information is asked to dial 911 and speak to an officer.

**Retail Theft - Fine Wine and Spirits - 127 W. Lancaster Av.**

Staff of the Fine Wine and Spirits Store, located at 127 W. Lancaster Av., reported a retail theft discovered from 3/13/2023. Video surveillance showed a tall black male with glasses, wearing a black winter hat and surgical mask steal six (6) bottles of alcohol from the store.

### **Retail Theft - T.J. Maxx Store - 550 E. Lancaster Av.**

Store security reported a retail theft from the T.J. Maxx Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av., that occurred on 3/12/2023. Video surveillance showed a white female, in her 30's, with light red/pink hair run out of the store without paying for a designer purse. The female was last seen entering a white work van that was being operated by an unknown black male.

### **Theft from Vehicles**

On Thursday, 3/23/2023, Radnor Police Police received several reports of vehicles entered overnight and items stolen. Reports were received from Wistar Rd. Countyline Rd. and Overhill Rd. of vehicles that had been left unlocked and had various items stolen from inside of them.

### **Criminal Mischief - 300 block of E. Lancaster Av. - Wayne Square Shopping Center**

Multiple acts of vandalism were discovered at 315 E. Lancaster Av. on Friday, 3/21/2023. Unknown actors used spray chalk to paint vulgar pictures and words on the the walls and a fountain at the above location.

### **Theft of a Motor Vehicle - 55 E. Lancaster Av. - Flemings Steak House**

On Monday, 3/27/2023, at approximately 2:24 AM, the victim discovered their vehicle stolen while parked near the loading docks of 555 E. Lancaster AV., Flemings Steak House. The vehicle was a 2019 Hyundai Santa Fe, and was left unlocked at the time of the theft. The keys are NOT with the vehicle.

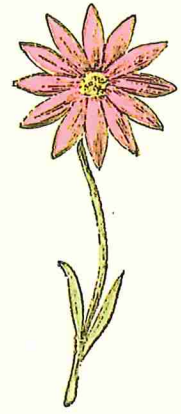
### **Theft from Storage Unit - Crestwood Apts. - 421 E. Lancaster Av.**

On Wednesday, 3/29/2023, the resident of the Crestview Apartments, 421 E. Lancaster Av., discovered their storage unit was broken into and items were removed. The victim reports the theft occurred sometime between December of 2022 and 3/29/2023.

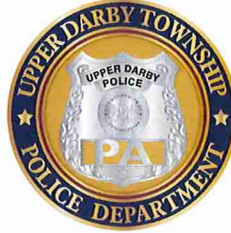

Many thanks again for such a great experience!

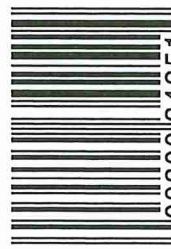
