JUNE 2023

On Thursday, 6/1/2023, Loss Prevention from the T.J. Maxx Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av., called to report several retail thefts that had occurred earlier in the week. T.J. Maxx reported three (3) thefts, two (2) occurred on Sunday, 5/28/2023 and one (1) occurred on Monday, 5/29/2023. in all three cases actors removed items from the store without paying.

Several vehicles were reported to have been entered overnight between 6/1/2023 (Thursday) and 6/2/2023 (Friday), in the Bryn Mawr section of Radnor Township. All the vehicles in question had items stolen out of them and all the vehicles were left unlocked at the time of the thefts.

Sometime overnight between 6/2/2023 and 6/3/2023, the resident of the unit block of Wistar Rd. reports their mailbox was vandalized. The mailbox was ripped off of its post.

On Saturday, 6/3/2023, the resident of the 800 block of Countyline Rd. reports property stolen from outside of their residence. The resident reports a flower plot was stolen from outside of the property.

On going traffic issues on Lancaster Av. in the area of the Interstate 476 Interchanges should be clearing up. Due to a serious accident on northbound I476, the Blue Route has been closed most of the morning. As a result, traffic in Radnor Township, especially in the area of Lancaster Av. and I476 Interchanges, has been extremely heavy and backed up. From The Pennsylvania State Police, the Blue Route has been re-opened and traffic should begin to clear out shortly.

The victim reported they believe their wallet was stolen while they were dining at Pietro's Pizza, located at 236 N. Radnor Chester Rd., between 5:00 PM and 7:30 PM on May 28, 2023. The victim was notified by their credit card concerning fraudulent activities on 6/12/2023. Pietro's Pizza is the last know location where the victim was in possession of their wallet.

Loss Prevention from the T.J. Maxx Store, located at 550 E. Lancaster Av., advised a retail theft occurred on 6/13/2023 at approximately 12:27 PM. Loss Prevention advised two black males removed approximately \$132.93 worth of men's items form the store without paying. It is believed by staff that these two men are the same two involved in a previous theft.

On 6/13/2023, both the Wawa, located at 201 Bryn Mawr Av. and 151 Sugartown Rd. received fraudulent coupons for the sale of cigarettes. It is believed that the same black male actor used fake manufacturer coupons to obtain cigarette from both Wawa stores.

On Thursday, 6/15/2023, the victim reported their purse stolen out of the vehicle while parked in the Municipal Lot located at 200 S. Bellevue Av. It is believed the theft occurred between 6:45 PM and 10:45 PM.

On Monday, 6/26/2023, at approximately 6:00 PM, two vehicles parked in the lot for Hartford Park, 260 Gulph Creek Rd., had items stolen from inside of them. The vehicles were unlocked at the time of the thefts, and no damage occurred to either vehicle.

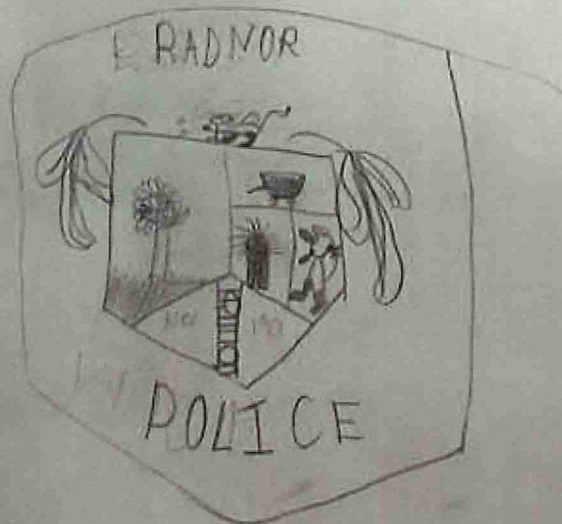
On 6/28/23, the Police Department received several reports of items being taken from several unlocked vehicles. These thefts occurred in the one and two hundred blocks of Beechtree Lane, four hundred block of St. Davids Ave, and one hundred block of Radnor Street Road. Anyone with further information or possible doorbell camera footage of suspicious activities are asked to contact Radnor Police.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.

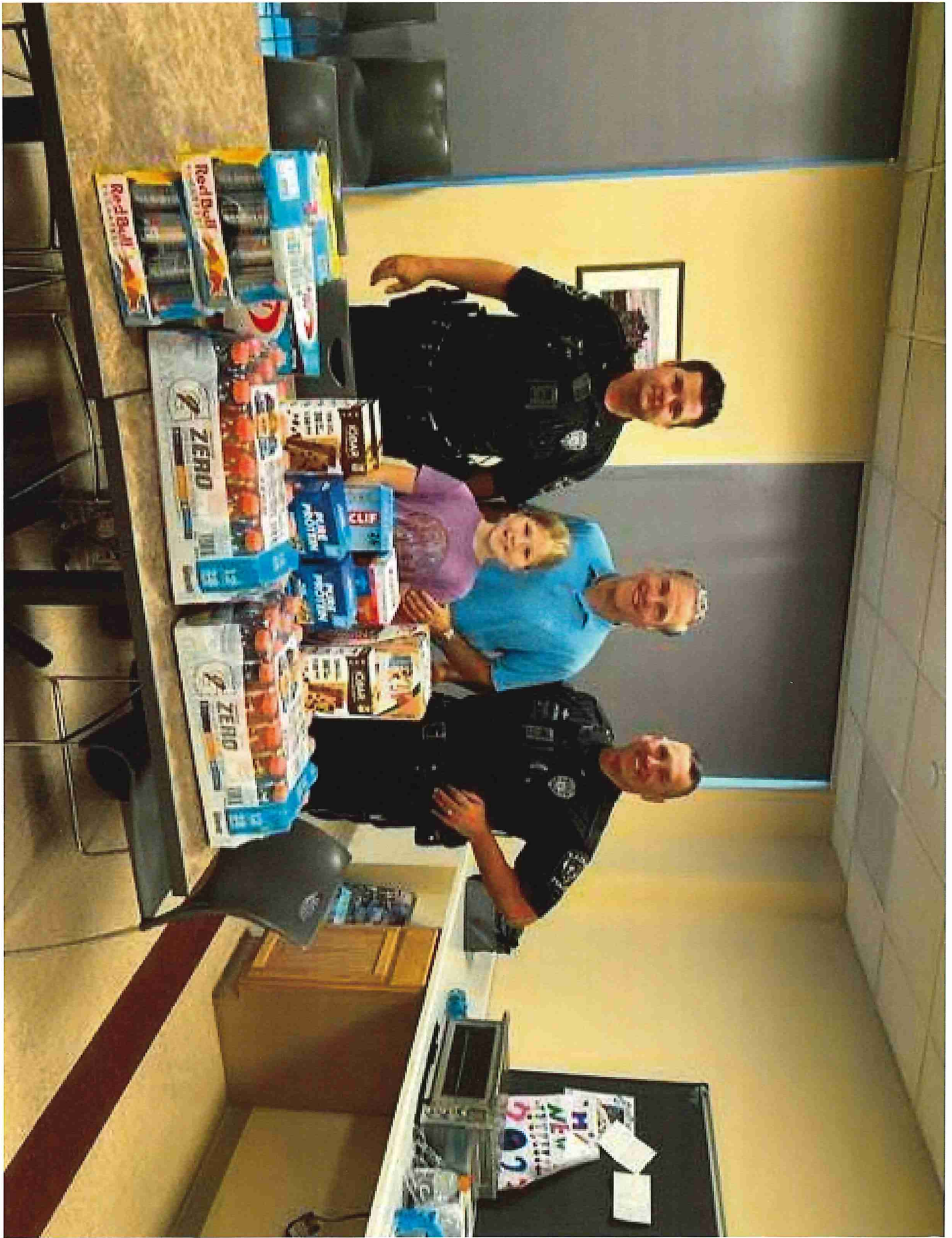


Dear Radnor Police Department,

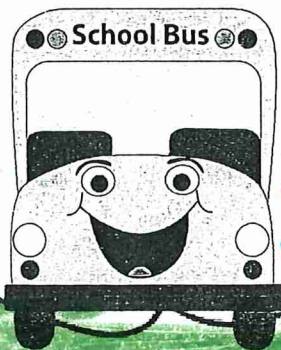
