CRIME ALERTS
JULY 2023

On Monday, 7/10/2023, the resident of the Radnor Crossing Apartments reports the theft of a package from their apartment's lobby. Video footage shows that on 7/9/2023, white male wearing a medical mask walking away from the victim's door with their package in hand.

On 7/9/2023, at approximately 1:31 PM, package was delivered to the 900 block of Weldon Lane and subsequently stolen from the property. Video surveillance show that at approximately 6:56 PM a black male, driving a black Nissan, arrives at the home. The male walks onto the property and steals the package.

On Monday, 7/17/2023, at approximately 4:59 PM a retail theft occurred at the Wawa Store, located at 201 Bryn Mawr Av. A white female and a black male were observed on video surveillance, exiting the store with several items that were not purchased.

On Wednesday, 7/19/2023, at 3:37 PM, the Wawa located at 201 Bryn Mawr Av. reported a retail theft had just occurred. Store employees advise that a black male just exited the store without paying for the an undetermined amount of items.

On Tuesday, 7/25/2023, T.J. Maxx security, 550 E. Lancaster Av., reported a retail theft that had occurred on 7/21/2023. On that date, a black male was observed on video surveillance, securing several items in a back pack and after removing their security devices, left the store without paying.

On Thursday, 7/27/2023, at approximately 11:59 AM several items were stolen from a vehicle parked in front of 958 Countyline Rd., the Eagle Cleaners. Two cell phones were removed form the business owner's vehicle.

On 7/28/2023, staff of the Little Shop, located at 503 W. Lancaster Av., report a retail theft that occurred on 7/19/2023. Video surveillance showed a white female, possibly of Mediterranean decent, place items into her purse and exit the store without making payment.

On Saturday, 7/29/2023, sometime between 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM the victim had items stolen from their vehicle while parked in the lot of Fenimore Park, 1194 Eagle Rd. The victim reports the rear window of their vehicle was smashed out and two cell phones and two purses were removed. Several of the credit cards located in the purses were attempted to be used at various locations.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.

Dear Traffic Safety Unit:



Their thought was to get settled and then come to you to request a stop sign.

Much to their surprise and delight last week, before they even made a request, stop signs appeared! The corner of W. Beechtree and Eagle Rd now has a 4-way stop!

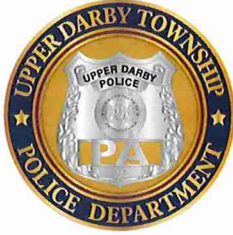
