Stolen Vehicle - 700 block of Moore Av.

The victim advised their car was stolen from the 700 block of Moore Av., sometime overnight between 9/9/2023 and 9/10/2023. The vehicle was left unlocked, and the keys were in the car at the time of the theft.

Public Indecency/Narcotics Offenses - Odorisio Park

On Tuesday, 9/12/2023, at approximately 3:56 PM the Radnor Police was dispatched to Ordorisio Park and the report a naked white male performing an indecent act. The male was quickly taken into custody and was found to be extremely under the influence of narcotics. He was also suffering from minor cuts and abrasions to his body. Located in his immediate vicinity were several remnants of used packets of narcotics. After an extensive investigation the male was charged with multiple crimes code violations including indecent exposure and the possession of a controlled substance.

The Radnor Police is asking if anyone may have seen this male prior to his contact with the Radnor Police, or especially if any juveniles were subject to viewing the male to please contact the Police Department right away. Also, if any one may have any video or cell phone pictures of this incident to please make them available to authorities as well.

Retail Theft - T.J. Maxx Store - 550 E. Lancaster Av.

On Thursday, 9/14/2023, the T.J. Maxx Store reported a retail theft that had occurred the day before on 9/14/2023. Store security reported that on Monday, 9/13/2023 at approximately 6:00 PM two black females entered the store and asked to see a high valued purse that is kept locked in a display case. Once the purse was handed to them, both females fled the store without making payment.

Criminal Mischief - 700 block of Church Rd.

On Thursday, 9/21/2023, workers from Pohlig Builders reported a racial slur was spray painted on the driveway of a house they are building in the 700 block of Church Rd. The slur was discovered on 9/20/2023, and the workers are not sure when it was put there.

Theft from Vehicles - Sandcastle La

Sometime overnight between 9/27/2023 and 9/28/2023 several vehicles were entered on Sandcastle La. All the vehicles entered were left unlocked at the time and were ransacked. It is unclear at the time of the report what if anything was stolen.

The Radnor Police respects citizens' privacy, civil rights, and civil liberties by emphasizing behavior, rather than appearance, in identifying suspicious activity. Factors such as race, ethnicity, and/or religious affiliation are not suspicious. The public should only report suspicious behavior and situations (e.g., an unattended backpack or package, or someone breaking into a vehicle or restricted area). Moreover, any physical descriptions are based on victim and witness statements provided to the Radnor Police at the time the incident was reported or developed through investigation.

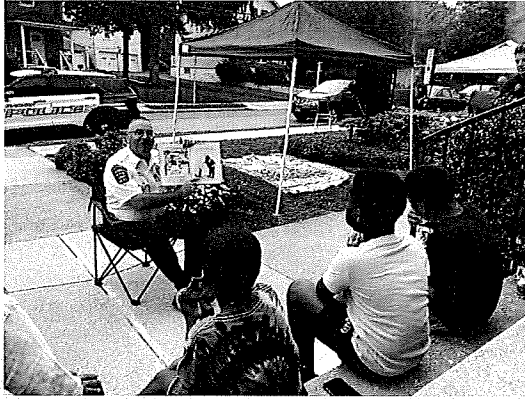


Dear Officer Collins,
