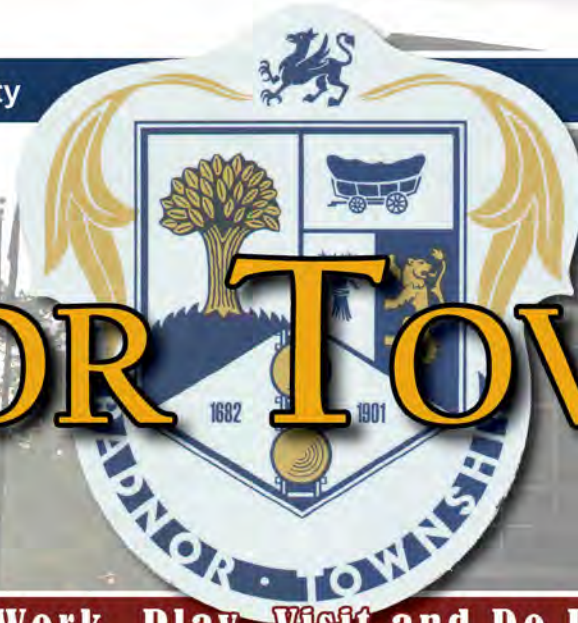

A Message from the Board of Commissioners

The Radnor Township Board of Commissioners is working hard to continue making a great place even better!

We're in a Transition Period – Hang in There!

Major projects were approved over the past two years, which is very exciting for the Township. However, now comes the difficult part of living through the construction phase.

Villanova University's plan to redevelop its parking lots along Lancaster Avenue was approved by the Board in the summer of 2015, which includes new dormitories with stores, a pedestrian bridge, a performing arts center, and a new parking garage. The parking garage has been completed, the pedestrian bridge is scheduled to be completed in early 2018, the dormitories are scheduled to be completed in summer 2019, and the performing arts center is scheduled to be completed in early 2020. The construction has caused traffic and dust on Lancaster Avenue and the Township continues to work with Villanova in monitoring it.

The Clem Macrone Park renovations were approved in 2016, bids were awarded, and construction began in late 2016. The renovations include upgraded playground equipment, improved and relocated restrooms, a pavilion, and stormwater management. I was very excited to be part of the vote that allowed the renovation of the Township's most heavily used park to finally move forward. The renovation is scheduled to be completed this spring in time for the Arbor Day Celebration and Garrett Hill July 4th Parade!

The Radnor Memorial Library renovation and expansion was approved by the Board in 2016 but, due to issues with the bidding process, did not get started until late 2016. The Library's plans will increase the size of the library, modernize its infrastructure and

services, and thus allow it to continue serving as a community hub for future generations. The timeline for the construction is approximately one year so I am looking forward to being able to walk over with my children and enjoy all that the Library will have to offer by the end of 2017!

Penn Medicine has requested that the Board consider altering its zoning ordinance for the Planned Laboratory and Office (PLO) district, which runs along King of Prussia Road from Lancaster Avenue to Matsonford Road. Penn Medicine is asking that the PLO zoning be amended to include mixed uses such as hotels, ambulatory care facilities, and assisted living facilities. The Board began discussing this in early 2016, formally introduced the new zoning ordinance in late 2016, and sent it to the Township and County Planning Commissions for review and comment. Stay tuned to see if the PLO zoning amendments move forward!

Please come on out for the Spring Eggstravaganza on April 2 at Villanova University Stadium, the Youth Trout Derby on April 22 and 23 at Saw Mill Park, the Arbor Day Celebration on April 28 at Clem Macrone Park, the Wheels of Wayne on April 30 on North Wayne Avenue, the Bike Rodeo on May 7 at the Wayne Art Center, and the Carol Axelrod Memorial Blood Drive on May 9 at the Township Building. Notify Me

Notify Me is through the Township website and includes detailed lists that you may subscribe for. Items may be added to these lists from time to time, so please check back every now and then to make sure you are receiving notifications that interest you. These notifications are by email and/or text only. Please visit www.radnor.com for more information.



CivicReady

This notification website is separate from the Township website but they are still connected together. Please visit our notification website at radnor.civicready.com where you may sign up for Emergency Alerts, General Notifications, Weather Alerts and Other Notifications.



Radnor Township Notifications include but are not limited to:

Emergency Alerts: Evacuation Notices, Flooding Alerts, and Missing Child Reports.

General Notifications: Trash Scheduling Changes, Township Events and Crime Alerts.

Weather Alerts: Blizzard, Earthquake, Flood, Severe Thunderstorm and Tornado Warnings.

Other Notifications: The Center for Disease Control, the Department of State and the World Health Organization.

A subscriber who has provided us with a voice number will be contacted via a pre-recorded voice message, a subscriber who has provided us with an email address will be contacted via an email message and a subscriber who has provided us with a SMS number will be contacted via text message. All messages will be about the nature of the event as well as proper response strategies that the public should undertake.

Although the Township has provided CivicReady with a general database of Radnor Township home and business phone numbers, residents are urged to subscribe all of their phone numbers (home and cell) to ensure that they receive proper emergency voice notifications.

Weather alerts are provided by the National Weather Service. Alerts automatically inform citizens in the path of severe weather moments after a warning has been issued by the National Weather Service. Please note that if the National Weather Service issues a severe thunderstorm warning for your area at 3:00am and you checked the severe thunderstorm notification check box you will receive a call around that time. Other alerts are also provided by outside parties and are held to the same example as the weather alerts. Options are available to choose when you wish to receive these alerts.

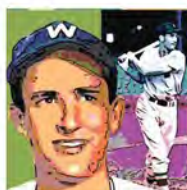

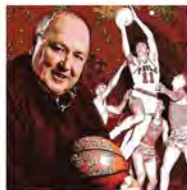

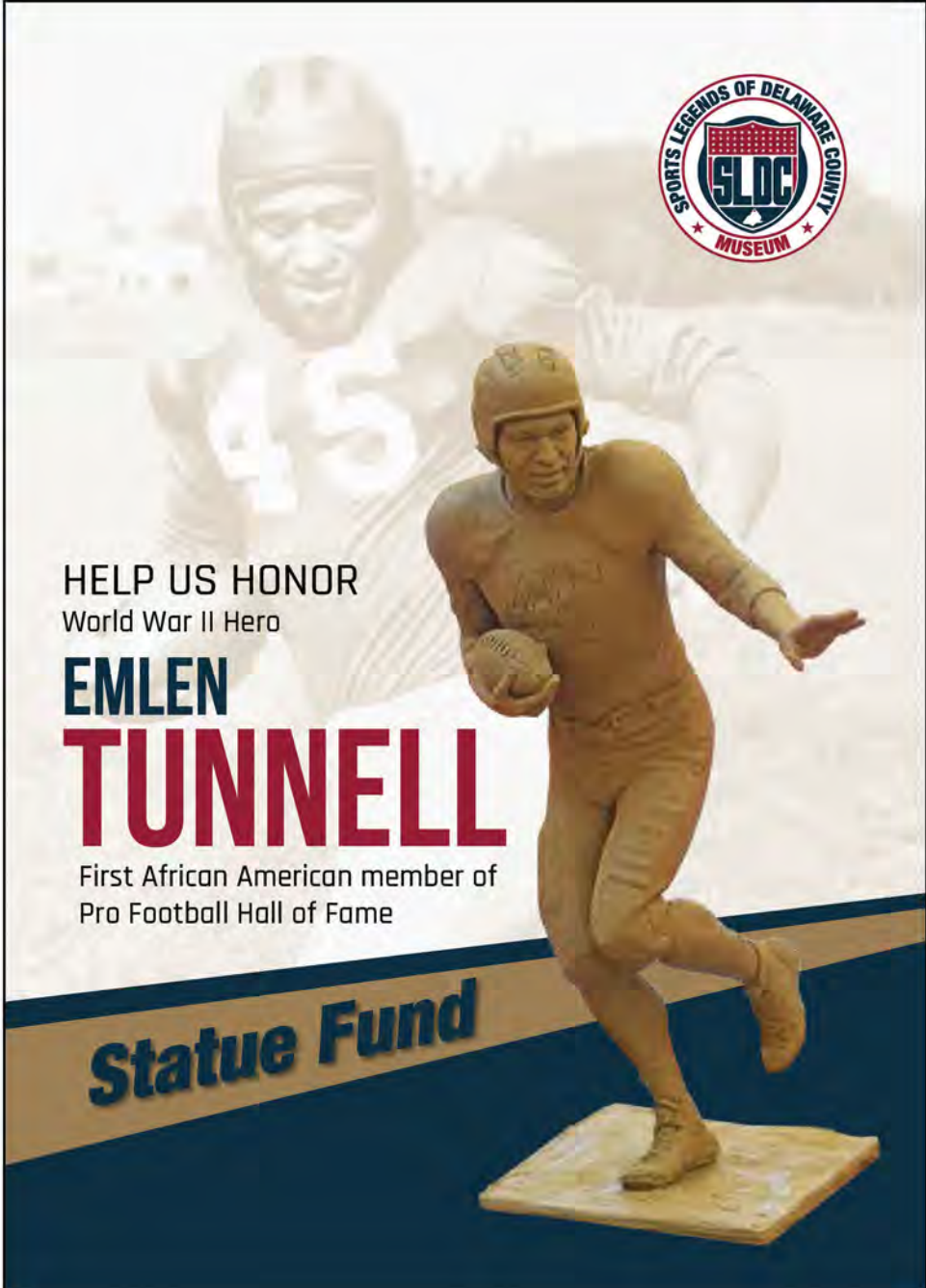

Radnor Multipurpose Trail
Trail Etiquette & Safety Guidelines

All Users:

- PLEASE OBEY SIGNAGE WHEN THE TRAIL IS CLOSED.
- STAY ALERT - Remove headphones and be aware of surroundings at all times.
- Be Courteous - The trails is for all users. Share the trail, and respect other users regardless of sport, speed, or skill level.
- Stay to the right at all times, expect when passing.
- When passing, make sure to look behind you, ring a bell or give a loud audible warning. Ring bell or call out "Passing on Your Left" when passing.
- Pass ONLY to the left and give at 2 foot clearance when passing.
- Do NOT block the trail by going 3 or 4 abreast.
- When stopping move off the trail. Be aware of others approaching you from behind and make sure they know you're pulling over.
- Yield to others when entering the trail and at crosswalks. When in doubt yield to others.
- STOP at stop signs, they indicate dangerous cross car traffic.
- When exiting the trail, stop, look and listen for motor vehicle traffic.
- Do not let your children ramble freely across the trail.
- Stay immediately behind or to the left of your children.
- Wear proper attire and safety gear for your recreational activity, including reflective gear, hat, sun block, helmet, pads, etc.
- Do not leave glass, paper, cans, plastic, or any other debris on or near the trail. Dispose of trash in proper containers.
- Respect private property and the privacy of people living along the trail.

BIKERS AND BLADERS:

- Travel at a safe and controlled speed. The Trail is not an appropriate place for high speed racing.
- Control your bike and be ready to stop.
- Remember: Wheels yield to heels.
- Adjust your speed to trail congestion and surface conditions.
- Be predictable - Travel in a consistent and predictable manner.
- Warn with a loud bell, whistle, or voice well BEFORE overtaking someone.
- Travel in single file, especially during busy times.
- Be sure child bikers are skilled enough to control the bike and maneuver as needed in order to stay safe.

PET OWNERS:

- Keep your pet on a very short leash and under control.
- Treat your pet as you would a child.
- Clean up after pet and dispose of waste in proper trash receptacles.

HIKERS & WALKERS:

- Do NOT READ while on the trail. Stay alert.
- If warned before being passed, call out, "Thanks for the warning!"
- If NOT warned before being passed, politely call out, "Please warn before passing!"
- Protect our environment - Stay on the trail and don't create short cuts or new paths.

PARKS DEPARTMENT

Our Parks Department works hard to maintain our parks and trails. The Township has 23 parks, the Radnor Trail, the newly acquired Ardrossan parcel as well as other open space areas. For more information on all of our parks please check the Radnor Township website. As soon as winter breaks, the Parks Department will be busy with a heavy spring cleanup throughout all of the parks. After the cleanup, crews will move right into mulching and edging of flower beds which is then followed with preparing the ballfields for spring baseball and lacrosse. Our field maintenance schedule also includes aerating and seeding all playing fields, as well as checking the play equipment for safety. Park restrooms will be cleaned and stocked after the last threat of winter. Restrooms are cleaned three times per week during the peak usage times. The fountains will be placed at the Willows pond, and we will begin our comprehensive mowing, trimming and weeding schedule. New bleachers will be installed in many of the parks this spring and summer.

SEWER DEPARTMENT

The Sewer Department has gotten a new On-and-Off Road Camera Unit. It is made for getting to off road locations like wooded areas and behind houses. Sewer lines that couldn't be televised before will be able to now with this new unit. As part of our routine preventative maintenance program, the Sewer Department continuously cleans sewer lines throughout the Township with our jet truck. With this new camera unit we are able to televise the sewer lines and discover defects in the pipe, root and grease problems with an inspection of each of the pipes following our cleaning and maintenance. Please remember that the Township is responsible for maintenance and repair to the sewer main (pipe in the street), while the homeowner is responsible for the maintenance and repair of their lateral (pipe from the house) pipe from the house to its connection to the main in the street.

Yard Waste Collection:
Collected curb side on Wednesdays (with the exception of holiday weeks), must be placed in bio-degradable paper bags or loose in a 35 gallon refuse container. Contents of container cannot exceed 50 lbs. **No plastic bags will be accepted.**
Tree trimmings and brush must be tied in bundles no longer than 3 feet in length and branches can be long larger than 2" in diameter. **No firewood will be collected.** Leaves will be collected in bio-degradable bags when placed at the curb except during the Township wide leaf collection in the fall. Up to 10 bundles/bags of yard waste per collection will be accepted.
Plastic bags, trash, grass, and dirt mixed with lawn debris is not permitted.

Recyclable items:
Yes: newspaper, inserts, junk mail, magazines, catalogs, envelopes, paper back books, phone books, cardboard, clean pizza boxes, office and school paper, color paper, cardboard (cereal, cake, and cracker boxes), paper egg cartons, paper bags (grocery type), aluminum cans, clean foil, tin and steel aerosol cans (empty), glass jars and bottles (empty), plastic containers #1 through #7.
No: garbage, plastic bags, food waste, food tainted items (used paper plates, paper towels, paper napkins), Styrofoam, motor oil bottles or hazardous chemical containers, plastic toys or sporting goods, electronics, batteries, CDs, DVDs, foam egg cartons, ice cream cartons, light bulbs, hangers, yard waste or garden tools.

Thinking about a Generator?

The weather patterns for the past few years have many people considering the installation of a portable generator or a stand-by permanent generator in case electricity service is interrupted. You are reminded that permits are necessary before a generator can be installed. While generators come in handy when severe storms knock out power, they need to be operated safely. You can't see or smell the deadly carbon monoxide produced by a generator and it can kill quickly. According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, one generator can produce as much carbon monoxide as hundreds of cars.



Here are some tips for using a portable generator:

- Use generators outside, away from windows, doors, and vents or any other opening in the house.
- Always read and follow the manufacturer's operating instructions before running generator
- Maintain your generator according to the manufacturer's maintenance schedule for peak performance and safety.
- Engines emit carbon monoxide. Never use a generator inside your home, garage, crawl space, or other enclosed areas. Fatal fumes can build up, that neither a fan nor open doors and windows can provide enough fresh air.
- Use a battery-powered carbon monoxide detector in the area you're running a generator.
- Gasoline and its vapors are extremely flammable. Allow the generator engine to cool at least 2 minutes before refueling and always use fresh gasoline. If you do not plan to use your generator in 30 days, don't forget to stabilize the gas with fuel stabilizer.
- Never operate the generator near combustible materials.
- If you have to use extension cords, be sure they are of the grounded type and are rated for the application. Coiled cords can get extremely hot; always uncoil cords and lay them in flat open locations.
- Never plug your generator directly into your home outlet. If you are connecting a generator into your home electrical system, have a qualified electrician install a Power Transfer Switch.
- Generators produce powerful voltage - Never operate under wet conditions. Take precautions to protect your generator from exposure to rain and snow.

Think Spring!!!

As the weather starts to warm up and all the snow and ice disappears, there is a tendency to want to make our outdoor living areas more livable. Often times, we are in a rush to soak up that first bit of nice weather and stretch our legs from a long cold winter. The anticipation of starting to whittle down the "To-Do" projects list that has been growing over the winter months can be a little overwhelming and these projects are often started without much of a second thought.



Did you apply for and receive a permit or even know that a permit was required? A permit is required for new construction, additions, alterations, any project that requires structural changes. Building permit applications are available on the Township website or at the Township office. Check with the Community Development Department before you make alterations to your home or business. Here are some of the improvements that require permits:

- Fences or walls • Structural repair or replacement • Shed, greenhouse • Fireplace
- Wood deck, patio, porch • Alternative Energy Systems
- Swimming pool, spa, or hot tub over 24 inches in depth
- Changes in use, home occupations, change in commercial tenants
- New buildings and additions • Heating and air conditioning replacement
- Roof replacement • Plumbing alterations • Signs • Electrical work or new installation
- Interior alterations



With the warming weather, now is the time people start to seek out a good safe Public Swimming Pool and secure their seasonal memberships. The following are recommended tips to inquire about in order to ensure a safe, fun swimming experience.

- Inquire if all lifeguards are certified as a Lifeguard, CPR, & 1st Aide.
- Inquire as to the ratio of lifeguards to bathers (1 per 50 is recommended).
- Inquire if the wading pool will be guarded by a lifeguard.
- Inquire as to the frequency of pool sampling during the day by lifeguards.
 - Indoor pools get sampled 2x per hour.
 - Outdoor pools get sampled 1x per hour.
- Inquire about the pool policy for accidents (Vomiting, Formed and loose Fecal matter).

Do You Own or Operate a Business in Radnor Township?

As a business owner, including landlords and persons operating a business from a home office, you are required to register your business and annually file a business tax return with the Township. The type of business you operate will determine whether you file a Business Privilege Tax Return or Mercantile Tax Return. In general, retailers file a Mercantile tax return while all others file a Business Privilege tax return. If you have any questions or are unsure if you are required to file, please feel free to call the Township at 610-688-5600 x152 or visit the Township website at www.radnor.com for forms and information. Do not delay... Tax returns are due by May 15th for the previous calendar year. If a valid extension request is filed with the IRS or State, the Township will accept this as an extension for your local return. While the extension allows for additional time to file your return, your tax liability must be satisfied by May 15th.

Finance Department is in the Midst of Implementing New ERP Software System

The Finance Department is extremely excited to announce that we are in the process of implementing Tyler Technologies' Munis government software Enterprise Resource Planning ("ERP") system. The Board of Commissioners authorized the purchase of the ERP system at their May 9, 2016 meeting with an estimated price of \$576,000. The ERP system will bring all the Township department's on to one, unified system. In doing so, departments will now be able to share information across the organization, improve transactional efficiencies, develop performance indicators, report on program-based activity and much, much more. At the same time, Radnor Residents will be able to create accounts and transact with the Township online. The implementation is broken into six phases that will span over a 24-month period. The first phase of the implementation, which began in August 2016, converts the general ledger accounting system. We are expected to go-live with phase 1 on July 1, 2017. The implementation, while exciting, draws considerably on the Department's resources. So it's taking a little longer to conduct our day-to-day business and perform the required implementation tasks. We appreciate everyone's patience and ask you to stay tuned for exciting service feature roll-outs in the months to come.

The Election Connection

Since it's founding in 1920, the primary mission of the League of Women Voters has been to register voters, provide nonpartisan information about candidates, and educate citizens about how government works. The 2016 Election has been an opportune time for League members, both men and women, to continue this tradition. With the cooperation of the Radnor Township School District, as well as private and parochial schools, academies, and universities, hundreds of students received cards, like that above, that provided links to on-line voter registration and candidate information. Several students even interrupted their lunch to fill out paper forms that were mailed to election boards by our members! Fifth graders in the public schools each received an activity booklet, *Electing the President*, compliments of the League.

Thanks to the support of Radnor Township, the Wayne Senior Center, the Wayne Business Association, the Radnor Memorial and Ludington Libraries, and many area churches, residents were able to obtain information and resources, not only for voter registration but also absentee ballots. Hundreds of citizens also connected with League members at the annual Fall Festival in Wayne and at SEPTA train and trolley stops on National Voter Registration Day.

With the collaboration of Studio 21, the members of the League were featured in several programs. Each was designed to help residents learn about the voter registration, how to watch a debate, or the voting process itself. Channel 21 also aired LWV candidate forums for the 165th and 166th legislative districts to provide voters with yet another source of non-partisan information. Radnor Township Television (RTV) assisted by posting important dates and other information for voters among their scrolling features.

Although the League's Voter Guide has become an on-line resource, hard copies were printed and made available to residents at local libraries and each polling place. Working with the Township, Voter Service Chair Gayla McCluskey obtained maps of each ward that were also posted at voting locations throughout Radnor to help residents avoid waiting in line at the wrong polling place. Each voter was also given an "I Voted" sticker, thanks to the generous contribution of a League member. The LWV has been and will continue to be connected with elections. We are helping to make democracy work!

What is the #1 stewardship activity you can do in your own yard to help protect the environment? Answer: Reduce the size of your lawn by at least 25%.

Yes, minimizing your turf grass or converting your lawn to a mixed landscape can save water, and energy, while reducing yard waste and the need for synthetic fertilizers.

- Reduced water consumption - according to the EPA, 30 to 60% of urban fresh water is used to water lawns each year. Turf requires two to three times the water of a sustainable mixed landscape.
- Saves time and energy on lawn maintenance.
- Less yard waste to be composted or taken to a landfill - a 2000 sq ft lawn produces 600-800 pounds of clippings per summer on average
- Reduction in use of herbicides, pesticides and synthetic fertilizers
- Reduction in air and noise pollution caused by gas mowers - lawns cover 20 million acres of residential land in the US, and lawnmowers account for 5% of the air pollution. A 3.5 hp lawnmower pollutes as much in one hour as an automobile driving 350 miles.
- Enhanced biodiversity - varied native plantings offer shelter and feeding opportunities for wildlife
- Do Not Use bug zappers – they kill the good insects!

What is the #2 stewardship activity you can do to protect the health of humans and wildlife in your own yard? Answer: Create Organic Lawns and Gardens.

Yes, by eliminating synthetic/chemical pesticides you are creating a healthier lawn/garden and protecting your family and wildlife around you.

- Chemicals actually degrade the over-all long-term health of your lawn and garden. By frequently applying pesticides to your lawn, you create a chemical-dependent landscape. As pest species become resistant to the chemicals designed to kill them, more concentrated doses and frequent applications are required and a never-ending cycle is established. When this happens, your lawn's health is spiraling downhill.
- Chemical pesticides and fertilizers contaminate surface and groundwater.
- Chemical pesticides threaten the health of children.
- Chemical pesticides and fertilizers reduce the activity of beneficial organisms.
- Talk to your Landscape Professional or DIY. Question what they are putting on your lawn. Ask if they have an organic lawn program. Or learn how to do it yourself. See below "Tips for a chemical free Lawns".

Skunk Hollow Community Garden

It's been about five years since two Radnor Township women had the same idea, at the same time - to create a community through gardening.

Sara Pilling and Katrina Ogilby both saw the potential in a plot of land at The Willows, which had once been home to a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) operation.

Tammy Cohen, the Director of Recreation and Community Programming, connected the two, who didn't know each other but soon became fast friends. With a little convincing, the Township Commissioners gave the pair the go ahead and a \$5000 grant from the William Penn Foundation provided seed money to launch the project.

Now Pilling and Ogilby, the founders of Skunk Hollow Community Garden, are stepping aside as other gardeners begin to take over their leadership roles.

"We both feel that it is important for the long-term sustainability of the garden to empower other people," said Ogilby.

In December, Township officials honored the pair with an Award of Appreciation.

About 65 families are now members of the Garden, which comes complete with piped-in water and a 10-foot deer fence. So far, there has been enough turnover to bring in new members each year, said Ogilby.

The core mission of Skunk Hollow is one of community.

Each gardener, whose ages range from four years to 80 years, is required to work in the common areas. Volunteer groups from Agnes Irwin School, The Haverford School, Villanova University and Harcom College have helped with garden chores. The Garden has also been a host station for the Township's Great American Backyard Campout event.

On Saturdays, members collect fresh vegetables to donate to Loaves and Fishes Food Pantry in Prospect Park. More than \$3500 in produce was donated last year, said Pilling.

The gardeners have come together for potluck dinners, going away parties, celebrations for upcoming weddings and birthdays, and have pitched in when other members needed help because of an illness.

"We have created a community in a way that I didn't understand," admitted Ogilby, who said she has had a chance to meet new friends she never would have crossed paths with before the Garden existed.

"It has been life giving to me," said Pilling who, as a Master Gardener Instructor, has become the go-to resource for both new and experienced members. "It is pretty magical."

WRC provides 4,300 services annually to approximately 2,500 women and girls. The agency's information and referral program serves as a vital link between people in need and hundreds of community services and resources. WRC also offers low/no cost counseling, legal consultation and seminars, Single Mothers Parenting, Girls Leadership Programs, Divorce Support Groups and resources and Career Services. An active group of 200 volunteers assist the small staff and group facilitators in offering these services at community sites in Chester, Delaware and Montgomery Counties.
